ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MALAYSIAN COUNTERPART

- 1. A person who consents to be the Malaysian counterpart of a foreign must undertake the following responsibilities:
 - 1.1. To submit application to the Inland Revenue Board (10 floor, Left Wing, Block 11, Jalan Duta KL) and Immigration Office in Putrajaya on behalf of researcher for Professional Visit Pass as soon as research is approved by Ministry of Economy (please refer to Flowchart To Get Professional Visit Pass From Immigration Department of Malaysia).
 - 1.2. Ensure that the foreign researcher whom he/she is responsible for abides by the "Code of Conduct for Foreign Researchers".
 - 1.3. Ensure that researchers conform to the rules pertaining to the collection and distribution of specimens is in accordance with the Guidelines For The Collection and Distribution of Specimens (APPENDIX B3) as specified by Ministry of Economy as well as specified by the relevant authorities.
 - 1.4. Ensure that the foreign researcher confines his/her research to the topic and the location approved by Ministry of Economy and do not deal with sensitive issues but concentrates on the research proposal as approved by Ministry of Economy.
 - 1.5. Under no circumstances discuss or pass on information about the research to the media.
 - 1.6. Furnish information and feedback as to the progress of the research to Ministry of Economy and other agencies, when requested.
 - 1.7. Ensure that the findings of the research are submitted to Ministry of Economy.
 - 1.8. Ensure the findings of the research are not published without prior approval of Ministry of Economy.
 - 1.9. Must be in Malaysia during the duration of research.
